1. Justification for application to this competition.

Provide a specific justification why support is being requested from this funding source, i.e. why other funds, currently held or potentially available, cannot be used. If funding is being sought for this project from other sources, it must be disclosed here.

2. Brief description of project.

Describe the project in 200 words or less and *in language suitable for communication with the general public*. If funding is awarded, this description may be used in reports, newsletters, or media releases. A brief statement of the objectives, method of investigation, and potential results should be included.

3. Project proposal.

Describe the project in detail and in terms capable of being understood by an academic from another discipline. Detailed technical terms and jargon should be avoided. Maximum length of 3 pages, single-spaced. References, if necessary, may follow on a separate page. All the following items must be identified by appropriate subheadings:

- a. Objectives and underlying hypotheses;
- b. The state of the knowledge bearing on the proposed project;
- c. The procedures or research design, including methods, analyses, and criteria for evaluation of results;
- d. The significance for your field of study and for your home University;
- e. The form of publication and/or presentation you expect the results to take;
- f. Justification for collaboration with host professor;
- g. Previous collaborations with host professor; and
- h. The potential for developing additional contact and cooperation, with a view, among other possible objectives, to promoting student mobility within the framework of OBW's programs.

4. Scholarly/Scientific Publications.

List the following information, identified by appropriate subheadings:

- a. Refereed publications (past 10 years)
- b. Non-refereed publications (past 10 years)
- c. Lifetime publications (statistical summary)
